Parenting Tips for the early school years

Promoting Independence (Part 3)..... While 3-and 4-year-olds still need plenty of parental help, preschool experts agree that kids are typically able to do more than many of us think. Here's how you can encourage them:

Don't Redo what they've done. If your son makes his bed, resist the urge to smooth the blankets. If your daughter dresses herself in stripes and polka dots, compliment her "eclectic" style. Unless absolutely necessary, don't fix what your child accomplishes, says Kathy Buss, director of the Weekday Nursery School, in Morrisville, Pennsylvania. Your child will notice and may be discouraged.

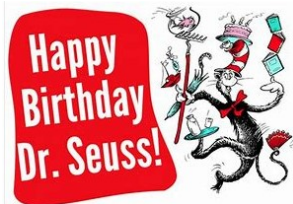

He will come on to teach us about violins and let the children play a violin.

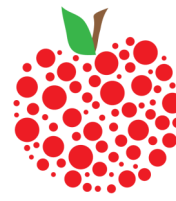

Leap Year

As March begins, some students have been wondering why every 4 years a leap year occurs. Join us on this Question of the Week discovery to find out! It all started in 45 B.C. when Julius Caesar figured out that every revolution (when the Earth goes around the sun one full time) takes 365.25 days. Since we can't just have one fourth of a day every year, every four years we add an extra day to the shortest month, February. It's called leap year because we leap to an extra day to February. If we didn't have a leap year, all



that time would pile up and, after 600 years, January 1 would be in the summer. The next Leap will be February 29, 2020. Next time it comes around, make sure to remember to share all the facts you've learned today!
